Ensure work is clearly differentiated across all year groups to ensure very good progress is made by all pupils. Ensure resources are sufficient and well used to allow children in KS1 and KS2 to become more familiar with scripture. Plan and deliver RE lessons to stretch the most able in upper KS2 ensuring they are confident and familiar with using and relating to scripture and achieve higher outcomes in line with the new diocesan assessments. Also ensure clear links to AT3 assessment. Provide extended opportunities for pupils to write longer prose of writing that clearly shows developing RE understanding through links to real experiences, scripture and other religious sources and a focus on AT3.	Planning to be completed on diocesan sheets which have assessment highlighted and to clearly indicate target groups. Stickers within lessons are to have learning focus and scripture link on it.
