#### Parents' Evening

Parents' Evening is being held on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> October between 3.30pm and 6.30pm in the school hall. You can book an appointment using smps.schoolcloud.co.uk. This is an excellent opportunity to chat with your child's teacher to review their progress so far this year.

#### **PTFA Autumn Craft Evening**

The PTFA are holding an autumn craft evening for children in Key Stage One and Key Stage Two. The event will take place on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October 3.15pm-4.15pm. The cost is £2, which will include a drink and snack. There are only 50 places available, and tickets can be bought from School Gateway.

This Wednesday, 18<sup>th</sup> October, the PTFA will be holding a Doughnut Day. Doughnuts can be bought at morning playtime and cost 50p each.

#### **Sporting Success**

It has been a busy time in school over the past few weeks. As well as the after school and lunchtime sports clubs running, there have been boys and girls football fixtures in the Newcastle Catholic Cup league. The boys' team competed against some of the best teams in Newcastle and performed really well. The girls' team played 4 matches, drawing 2 and winning 2. St Michael's also competed in a rugby competition, coming fourth. We are very proud of all our sporting achievements and our children.

#### **School Communication**

Parents should have access to School Gateway and Seesaw. School Gateway is the application that is now being used to communicate key message and information with parents. The app allows you to authorise and pay for trips and school dinners also. Parent feedback on School Gateway is



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positive, with many parents reporting that the app is easy to use. Please ensure you download the app or speak to the school office if you are experiencing any difficulties.

Children will continue to use Seesaw to complete homework and class teachers will send class updates via Seesaw.

## **School of Sanctuary**

We are delighted that we have been awarded the School of Sanctuary award for the second time. Two of our wonderful pupils attended a celebration event at the Great North Museum, to collect the award on behalf of the school community.

### **Stay and Play**

Every Tuesday, Stay and Play runs in the school hall from 9.00am. All parents with children in nursery class are invited. If you or anyone you know has a baby or toddler aged 0-3 years, they are also welcome to attend.

#### Year 2

Year 2 have been enjoying Dance lessons with Beth. They have learnt about travelling, levels and have worked in teams. They are now putting together a routine to dance together as a whole class.



#### **Eco-Warriors**

This year the Eco Warriors are looking at how litter is damaging the environment. They have started a weekly litter picking club, picking litter up on the KS1 and KS2 yards. The Eco Warriors are going to work in pairs each week and choose children in KS1 and KS2 to help them. They thought this would encourage the children to understand it is important to pick up litter. They will also lead an assembly to highlight the importance of litter picking in the coming weeks.



#### **Shakespeare Training**

This week, Mr Winskill has travelled to Stratford Upon Avon to participate in training with The Royal Shakespeare company. Mr Winskill and Mrs Simonson, who has already completed the training in Stratford, will run a Shakespeare after school club in the summer term, in preparation for a performance in the summer.
